Message from the Founder

In 2018, the theme for our annual gala celebration was "Putting the Pieces Together", which is apt to describe the year as a whole. It truly felt like a year where the pieces were falling into place for many families, staff, and relationships with partners.

Our communities have always been riddled with addiction, mostly alcohol but drugs as well. We have advocated for choosing a different path but in the past no one seemed to be able to break the cycle. In 2018, the cycle was finally broken by a handful of parents. Though a small ripple of change in the ocean of social problems we face, a ripple all the same. The attitude and behavior of the children of these families changed overnight. These parents were able to secure work, bringing financial security with it.

Educational successes continued in 2018 with graduates of Grade 10, Grade 12 and even university degrees. With support from Children's Hope India, Inc. we were able to start a University Loan Fund enabling students to not just dream of graduation but a career enabling them to support their families and improve their standards of life.

We continue to have a loyal family of donors and supporters (the Edmonton Gala family, the school communities in and around Edmonton, Children's Hope India Inc., all financial donors, the American School of Bombay and the list goes on). Volunteers have always been what makes One! International special and the renewed interest in foreign volunteers on the ground in India bring fresh energy and new perspectives to the schools. Volunteers in Canada continue to allow One! International maintain a low administration/fundraising percentage – as much money as possible can then go to support programs for the children.

Unfortunately, we had to halt our Village Project. We were not able to find the balance between all of the moving parts – the village council, the government school and the needs of the community members. We learned a lot from the project and are confident that we will be able to take that knowledge forward into a new village when the time is right financially and our efforts and resources will be fully utilized.

The violence in our communities continues to grow and have a negative affect on the families and schools. The increased fear and stress makes it hard to maintain hope that better is possible. We work hard every day to alleviate these fears and encourage positive change and positive mindsets. We focused on the language used at our schools with a focus on respect, professionalism and treatment of women. As people's language changed, not only did they themselves become automatically more positive but the relationships they had with others were noticeably better. This brought confidence and pride along with it.

After 14 years, we moved the Khar School; a scary prospect that instead became opportunity. It felt like a graduation as we embarked on new programs, developed new techniques, and confidently faced each new situation. The pieces fell together and proved that the One! International's family is ready to face anything!





VOLUNTEERS – INDIA

One! International has been very fortunate to attract volunteers from all over the world who have gone to India to work with the children for varying periods of time.

Volunteers in India are responsible for assisting the children to grow academically, as well as assisting in areas of personal health, sporting activities, creative play time, and learning about future opportunities for themselves and their families. Typical duties of a volunteer include teaching classes (usually to the younger children – basic hygiene, English, mathematics, cooperative play, etc.), sharing their skills with the Indian staff, and administrative tasks (example: reporting). Volunteers also help with organizational duties, and activities such as drama productions, art projects, and field trips.

In 2018 there were 7 different volunteers from Australia, Canada, and the United Kingdom. These 7 volunteers contributed 9 and $\frac{1}{2}$ months of volunteer work at the schools in India. One! International is lucky to have part-time volunteers in India that give anywhere from 1 to 8 hours per week.

VOLUNTEERS – CANADA

There is no paid staff in Canada other than a small percentage of the President's salary.

Volunteers are relied on for: administrative tasks, financial record keeping, contacts with local schools for awareness building, fundraising activities, management of the Indian volunteer program, major fundraising activities such as the annual Gala held in January/February of each year. There are also a group of volunteers who assist virtually with grants, web page updates, and data system management.

In 2018 there was a core group of 10 regular volunteers, with an additional 20-25 called on for various functions, especially the annual Gala Celebration.



PROGRAMS

GIVE-A-CHILD-A-CHANCE (GCC)

The GCC program helps to provide: education, one meal a day for six days of the week, counseling for families and children, daily first aid and medicines as required, encouragement to improve life circumstances, and other support. The aim of the program is to give the children love, hope, and a chance for a better future.

One! International provides sponsors with a matched child's history: name, birth date, family, strengths, weaknesses, likes, dislikes and dreams. Every six months, as possible, sponsors receive their child's update, with two new pictures, art work, schoolwork or exams, report card, and news of the organization. Giving a chance to a child is only \$30 (CDN) or the equivalent thereof.

In 2018, there were approximately 31 children who were sponsored through the GCC program.

OPERATIONS SUPPORT PROGRAM (OS)

The Operations Support Program helps cover the operating costs incurred in providing the day-to-day services: teacher's salaries, rent, transportation, sports activities, and travel. OS donors typically give a monthly donation of \$50 per month. Some donors commit to varying other amounts from \$25 to \$110 per month.

A one-time donation of any amount can also be donated for use in these areas. We have received donations ranging from \$10 to \$2000. All donations, regardless of the amount, are appreciated.

There were 14 on-going monthly OS contributors, and numerous one-time OS donations during 2017.

EMERGENCY & MAJOR MEDICAL FUND

This program is dedicated to providing urgently needed medical attention/supplies as required – often in life-threatening situations. The program was started in 2011 following a tragic situation in late 2010 when one of One! International's first 8 children (Kokila) was badly burned in a domestic propane accident. The One! International family of donors was incredibly generous in providing additional support and money. This young lady's life was saved. Originally called the Kokila Medical Fund, it was renamed in 2012 to the Emergency Medical Fund, and again in 2015 to Emergency & Major Medical Fund to distinguish the fund from the daily provision of routine medical services covered under general operations.

There were various donors to the fund in 2018 with one donor giving on a monthly basis.

CANADIAN SCHOOLS & COMMUNITY AWARENESS

Several schools in Canada request presentations to their students regarding life on the other side of the world. India is part of the curriculum for Social Studies. Presentations are made, and many schools choose to do a fundraising activity as part of the awareness program. Numerous community presentations and/or displays are completed throughout the year.

In 2018, One! International took part in 5 school class presentations, 2 volunteer appreciation activities, and the Just One World fair trade event.



STORIES

Student Experience – Jeetu



Twenty-year-old Jeetu proves that, one step at a time, one person can not only make a difference in their own lives but in their whole family's life and positively affect the greater community. Jeetu was the first in his family to become literate and took it many steps farther by first Graduating Grade 10 (a big milestone in India) and then graduating from Grade 12. Jeetu embarked on a dream this year of becoming a mechanic. He is halfway through the one year course while at the same time finishing his Bachelor of Commerce Degree (he has already finished year 2 of 3). If that wasn't enough, Jeetu works part-time at the Nallasopara school to help support his family. Jeetu is driven, enthusiastic and a positive influence for everyone around him.

Client Staff Experience - Anita



When Anita first joined the One! International staff, she was shy and lacked confidence. Though still quiet, she is no longer shy or lacking in confidence. She was promoted this year to medical co-ordinator and has shown great aptitude at learning the new role and the incredible amount of information to be able to do it well. She has built great relationships with the students and families, her calm nature allowing them to open up and tell her their problems. Anita welcomed twins of her own this year seemingly effortlessly manages to be a fantastic mom while still keeping up with her dedicated work. Though she is literate, she was not given the chance in her life to pursue studies. Despite this, she proves that sometimes all people need are the right opportunities to truly succeed.

Family Experience - Sohail, Rizwana and Sama



Mother Rizwana first started sending Sohail to the One! International school in Khar in 2010 when he was only 5 years old. 2 years later, Sama also started attending when she was 4. Rizwana was given a job as a cleaner and PreStep Mom. Rizwana's husband was an alcoholic and was physically abusive on a daily basis – never to the children. Now, he is still an alcoholic but has stopped abusing. In fact, he has become a community activist helping out any family in emergency situations and notifying our social

workers of any issue that needs addressing. His change in attitude has allowed the family to flourish, especially the children. Sohail studied in Grade 10 this year even though he was too young to register; he is excited to officially enter Grade 10 next year. Sama, also well ahead for her age) wants to become a flight attendant while Sohail wants to become a singer (engineering is the back-up plan). Rizwana is a fantastic employee, always ready to work with a smile.

Staff Experience - Vikas



One! International Poverty Relief is lucky to have staff that are loyal and dedicated. Vikas is a prime example of this. He has been with our team in India for 11 years. We have watched him learn new skills and develop into a highly professional and invaluable team member. Vikas is ready to do any task no matter the difficulty or comfort level. As our senior Medical Coordinator, he has built incredible relationships with public hospital staff throughout the city and is able to get work done efficiently and often with reduced rates. The community trusts him which made it easy for him to become a fantastic social worker. He is able to give suggestions to families for better lives – a true catalyst for change. He excitedly got married this year and is ready for the next chapter of his life – but he is dedicated to continuing the One! International chapter and we are grateful.
